## Mary the Mother of God and A New Year and God's Plans

As we start a new year, it is very fitting each year to celebrate during our Lord's Birth in the Christmas Season, to acknowledge the fact that <u>Mary</u>, the Blessed Mother, is the Mother of God. The feast day was this past Wednesday, January 1st.

After the Angel Gabriel visited Mary, announcing that She was chosen to be the Mother of the long-awaited Savior, of which Mary's response was 'yes' to the angel, Mary traveled to visit Her cousin Elizabeth. Upon seeing Mary, Elizabeth proclaimed Mary to be the Mother of God with the words: "Most Blessed are You among women and blessed is the Fruit of Your Womb. And how does this happen to me that the Mother of my Lord should come to me?" (Lk 1: 42-43)

As we acknowledge the Blessed Mother Mary as Mother of God, we also ask for Her Intercessions that in this new year, we not only do what we want to do, but also everyday to ask our Lord, "What is Your Will? What is Your Plan for me today?"

In the Gospel Readings according to St. Luke, Mary is reflecting in Her Heart, all of the things that have taken place surrounding Jesus' Birth. She reflects especially on all the shepherds in the field who had told them that they had seen *the star over Bethlehem, and the angels singing*. It says that "Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them, in Her Heart." (Lk 2: 19)

My friends, we are invited to this new year to do what Mary did. So, therefore, reflect on what Jesus is doing in your life and to look forward to His Plan for you in this new year. I want at this time to ask the following questions for us to reflect upon and to answer:

What are the good things and events in your life that happened this past year?

How can these things and the positive effects of these events be sustained or even made better in this new year?

In what ways do you want God to help you with new goals and plans in this new year?

When we pray the Our Father, especially the words, "Thy Will be done", believe that God will help to lead us successfully to His Plan in this new year and beyond.



# 20 + C + M + B + 25



On the Feast of Epiphany, Catholics traditionally bless their homes by writing the letters C, M, and B and the numbers of the year on the top of their front door frame with chalk. The letters stand for the traditional names of the three Magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. The following blessing can be used during the home blessing.

"Bless, O Lord God Almighty, this home, that in it there may be health, purity, the strength of victory, humility, goodness and mercy, the fulfillment of Thy Law, the thanksgiving to God the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. And may this blessing remain upon this home and upon all who dwell herein. Through Christ our Lord. Amen." (www.catholicnewsagency.com)
