Sharing Our Faith Series Sacred Scriptures and a Saint

Scripture: First Reading at Mass Wisdom 7:7-11

Wisdom is one of the Gifts of the Holy Spirit that we receive at our Confirmation. A good way to look at this Spiritual Gift is in praying for the Grace in making good personal decisions for yourself and good decisions for the people for whom you are responsible.

Psalm: 90: 12-13, 14-15, 16-17, 24

We repeat the words: "Fill us with Your Love, O Lord, and we will sing for joy." What beautiful words to say to God especially each morning as we get up and start our day. In fact, this positive outlook gets even better with the words of prayer in the second verse: "Fill us at daybreak with Your Kindness, that we may shout for joy and gladness all our days" and in the final verse: "Prosper the work of our hands."

-Each morning this week, thank Jesus for your life and ask Him to fill you with love and kindness that you will radiate joy to others and also in the work that you do that day.

Scripture: Second Reading at Mass Hebrews 4: 12-13

"Brothers and Sisters: Indeed the Word of God is living and effective . . ." The Bible is the Word of God. Therefore, the words of the Bible are living and effective words that can help us and guide each of us on the right path everyday. The Bible guides us with words of comfort and healing: "Your souls will find rest for my yoke is easy and my burden light" and, "I sought the Lord, and He answered me and delivered me from all my fears." (Matthew 11: 30) (Psalm 34: 5)

The Bible is also effective in guiding us with words of commands such as "you shall not kill; you shall not commit adultery; you shall not steal; …" (Mark 10: 18)

These are some of the Ten Commandments in this weekend's **Gospel of Mark 10: 17-30** that Jesus reminds the young man when he asked Jesus: "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" After the young man said that he has observed these commands, Jesus presents to him a deep and real cost of discipleship which the man was unable to do: "Go sell what you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven . . ." (Mark 10: 21) Let's put the above Scriptures together in a prayer to God:

-My Lord and God, please give me the wisdom from these Sacred Words of the Bible to joyfully and faithfully follow You and to be Your Disciple wherever You lead me in life. Amen!

NEW FORMAT

Saint John Paul II Karol Józef Wojtyla was born in Wadowice, Poland, in 1920. He had much loss of his family at an early age; loss of his mother, father, and brother by the time Karol was twenty years of age. He had a deep prayer life and studied acting during his college years. Eventually, he entered seminary in the early 1940's during the hardest time of World War II.

Karol was ordained a priest in 1946, and eventually became the Archbishop of Krakow. He took part in the 2nd Vatican Council from 1962 to 1965. On October 16, 1978, he was elected Pope and took the name of John Paul II.

In his ministry as Pope, he had a special apostolic zeal for families and young people, as well as for the sick and suffering. He renewed the New Code of Canon (Church Law) in 1983 and gave us the New Catechism in 1995 and the Roman Missal during the renewal of Sacred Liturgy in 2010. He brought the Church into the new millennium by emphasizing new life in the spirit, devotion to our Blessed Mother, and a renewed dignity of human life. My personal experiences of Pope John Paul II in person was as a seminarian when he was in Philadelphia, and at World Youth Day in 1993, and again in 2002. An amazing person! God Bless, Father Mark
