Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments-Digital Dating Abuse can be defined as "a pattern of behaviors that control, pressure, or threaten a dating partner using a cell phone or the internet." One quarter of youth (12-17) who have been in a romantic relationship during the previous year report that they'd been the victim of digital dating abuse. The Presentation of the Lord

This weekend, we bless candles that are used both at Mass and at home. This Feast of the Presentation of the Lord falls every year on February 2nd. The reason why we bless candles on this Feast Day is because when Mary and Joseph brought the baby Jesus to the temple, forty days after His Birth, the prophet Simeon gave a blessing to Jesus and said: "Now Master, You may let Your Servant go in peace, according to Your Word, for my eyes have seen Your Salvation, which You prepared in the sight of all peoples: a <u>light</u> for revelation to the Gentiles and glory for Your People Israel." (Lk 2: 29-32) Jesus is that <u>light for revelation</u> that Simeon had proclaimed.

The First Saint in February: Saint Blaise

Patron of throat illnesses, animals, and wool trading (loyolapress.com/saints/saints-stories-for-all-ages/saint-blaise) <u>Feast Day</u>: February 3 <u>Death</u>: 316 A.D.

About four hundred years after his death, many stories began to be told about Blaise. He became a popular Saint, especially in France and Germany. One legend says that while Saint Blaise was on his way to prison, a mother brought her small boy, who was choking on a fish bone that was stuck in his throat, to him. Saint Blaise prayed over the child, and the child was healed immediately.

Every year, on Saint Blaise's Feast, two candles, tied with ribbon in the shape of an X, are used to bless throats. In the prayer, the Church prays that those blessed may be delivered from diseases of the throat and from every other illness.

Candles are used because it is said that while Saint Blaise was kept in a dark prison, a woman secretly brought him some candles and food.

Why do Catholics Light Candles?

As Catholics, we light candles because it is a symbol for us that our prayers are being continually lifted up to God as long as the flame on the candle is lit. The flame represents our love, care, and concern about the one for whom we are praying. The candles in our Church candle shrine burn for six days. This means that when we light a six day candle for someone, it's almost as if we are praying for that person, continuously, without stopping, for six days. Today, or sometime this week, go to the candle shrine in the back of the Church and light a candle for a loved one and for a special intention.
