Our Invitation for Inner Strength

I have been told the story of a courageous woman who lived in the early 20th century. She was poor and had five children. Her husband died suddenly--four days before their sixth child was born. Can we imagine what she was going through? She spent hours praying in the closest Catholic church. She gained inner strength to carry on with the help of friends and with the Grace of God, in order for her to provide for her children as a single mom. This provided a new hope for her. In a like manner, God had provided hope and strength to His People, as we hear about this in the following Readings.

In the First Reading, during this First Sunday of Advent, there are affirming words of strength and hope to the people of Israel in the midst of being taken over by the enemy Babylonians. The Prophet, Jeremiah, says: "The days are coming, says the Lord, when I will fulfill the promise I made to the House of Israel and Judah...Judah shall be safe...Jerusalem shall dwell secure..." (Jer 33: 14-16) The inner strength and hope of these people are God's Reign and Kingdom, which will come through a messiah in the line of David, which was fulfilled in Jesus.

The Second Reading, from the First Letter of Saint Paul to the Thessalonians, gives inner strength to a Christian community, who are anxiously and even desperately, awaiting the return of Christ in glory. They need to be patient, but St. Paul does affirm their love in order to replace the doubt in their hearts and to strengthen them. St. Paul's words are...

> Brothers and sisters; "May the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all, just as we have for you, so as to strengthen your hearts." (1 Thes 3: 12-13a)

Finally, in the Holy Gospel according to Luke, Jesus is direct in saying that the time before He comes back again will be a time of dismay among nations, fear and fright in people's hearts, and in daily anxieties. But, His Words of hope and strength are "Be vigilant at all times and pray that you have the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand before the Son of Man." (Lk 21: 36)

Now, ask yourself, in light of these Sacred Scriptures, the following question:

Where in my life have I experienced the inner strength of God helping me with a problem or great concern over something or someone?

Whatever your answer is, pray the above Scripture Passages. It can be your invitation for inner strength and peace, now and well beyond the Season of Advent. \rightarrow

The Examen As we begin this Holy Season of Advent, the Scriptures help us to be consciously aware of some special ways God is working in our lives. God will take the initiative to show us personally, but we must strive to watch for it so we can recognize God's Action. St. Ignatius of Loyola can help us be aware of God's Presence and Action in our lives, with the prayer practice called the *Examen*. This is simply to take ten to fifteen minutes, toward the end of the day, to review and reflect on ways God was helping you to understand His Activity in your life. Sit quietly and do the following:

Thanksgiving: Identify the actual blessing you have received from God and say in prayer "Thank you, God." Light: I pray to be able to see the truth of myself as God sees me.

Review of the Day: As I look at how things went in my life this day, what was the one thing or event that stands out most? What are my thoughts and feelings about it?

Response: In response to the above questions, was it something positive or negative? Were there both positive and negative events that occurred that day?

Action: If the event or experience was not good, then plan how to correct it for the next day. If the things in life that day are good, positive, joyful events, attitudes or situations that went well, then decide how it can be repeated for the next day. Conclude with the *Our Father*. Advent is a season of *hope and joy*. Let's watch for it! God Bless!
