#### Mercy and Rescue: God's Gifts to Us

This weekend, the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time, we hear again at Mass, as in the past two weeks, about God's Merciful actions. On the 28th Sunday, we heard about how God had mercy and healed Naaman and the ten men who had leprosy.

Last Sunday, we heard how God had mercy on Moses, Joshua, Aaron, and Hur, who won the battle against Amalek who waged war on them. We also heard about how God will intervene with His Justice and Mercy for the rights of a person who is persistent, such as the widow. This Sunday, we hear how our Lord rescued St. Paul from the lion's mouth and from evil threats against him. Then in the Gospel, God has mercy on the humble and repentant tax collector. I believe we hear, loud and clear, that God wants us to experience and constantly receive these gifts of mercy and being rescued from danger, evil, and sin.

At this time, let us all reflect on the words of Psalm 34: 2-3, 17-18, 19, 23 that are in today's Readings and ask ourselves how this Psalm speaks to us and our need for God's Mercy and the situations from which we need rescued in life. After reading this Psalm, answer the questions that follow.

#### Psalm 34: 2-3, 17-18, 19, 23 (7a)

I will bless the Lord at all times; His Praise shall be ever in my mouth.

Let my soul glory in the LORD; the lowly will hear me and be glad.

The LORD confronts the evildoers' to destroy remembrance of them from the earth.

When the just cry out, the LORD hears them; and from all their distress He rescues them.

The LORD is close to the brokenhearted; and those who are crushed in spirit He saves.

The LORD redeems the lives of His Servants; no one incurs guilt who takes refuge in Him.

Questions I pose to you...

In what way has Our Lord shown you mercy recently? From what has Jesus rescued you and saved you? Recently, have you asked for God's Forgiveness?

With these questions, whatever your answers are, may they help you learn more about yourself and your relationship with God.

#### The Act of Contrition

When during the Sacrament of Confession, we have confessed our sins and the priest assigns us a penance, we then pray The Act of Contrition. There are actually two different Act of Contrition we can pray during Confession. The first one we all know:

"O My God, I am heartily sorry, for having offended Thee. And I detest all my sins, because of Thy Just Punishments. But most of all, because they offend You, My God, Who are all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of Thy Grace, to sin no more and to avoid the near occasion of sin." Amen!

The other Act of Contrition is very brief and is found in this Sunday's Gospel in the words of the humble tax collector: (the prayer) O Jesus, Son of the Living "God, be merciful to me a sinner." (Lk 18: 13b)
