A Family Perspective In today's Gospel, Jesus was 'praised by all' except in his hometown of Nazareth, where 'the eyes of all were intently on Him.' Acceptance can be difficult to find a home due to unrealistic EXPECTATIONS. Jesus challenges us to 'proclaim liberty' to anyone 'oppressed' or 'captive' by our EXPECTATIONS.

Marriage Moment "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." (Jn 15: 13) On your wedding day, you laid your very life into the hands of another person without knowing what the future held. (Leif Kehrwald, *Marriage & the Spirituality of Intimacy*) Sometimes it is hard to love unconditionally, isn't it?

#### The Power of Words

Words always had and will continue to be a powerful and effective way of communication. The use of words in describing things, people, places, facts, truths, and experiences can touch our deepest emotions, intellect, and imagination.

If I were to describe a beautiful winter day, the sun shining in a bright, blue sky, snow on the ground, with the branches of each tree encircled with a beautiful glaze of ice and snow, you would be able to see it in your mind and perhaps the exact place where you last saw that description of nature's artwork. Words have a way of taking us there. So does Gods Word take us there. Where, you might ask? To the happiness of eternal life that begins here and now and the power of the Holy spirit you have within you now.

The First Reading from the Book of Nehemiah and the Gospel from Luke are about reading and listening to God's Word as recorded in the Sacred Scriptures. The head of the people, Nehemiah, and his priest/scribe, Ezra, encouraged the down-trodden people after reading from the Book of the Law by saying to them... "do not be saddened this day, for rejoicing in the Lord must be your strength." (Neh 8: 10b) The people of God were able to freely imagine this joy.

In a like manner in our Gospel Reading, Jesus returned "to Nazareth where He had grown up" (Lk 4: 16a) He read from the Prophet Isaiah the words that would begin to be Jesus's Own Mission Statement:

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me, because He has anointed Me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent Me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord" (Lk 4: 18-19) The people in Nazareth were happy to hear these words. They were able to freely imagine this *Good News*.

#### A Saint in January

Saint Thomas Aquinas: Priest and Doctor (teacher) of the Church. (1225-1274) Saint Thomas Aquinas's greatest contribution to the Church is entitled "*The Summa Theologiae*" which is the summing up of the whole of Catholic Theology. Interestingly enough, he stopped his work of completing the *Summa*. After celebrating Mass in December, 1273, he realized that all that he wrote "was like straw" compared to the heavenly ecstasy he experienced that day. We study the Summa Theologiae in Seminary because of the great comprehensive work that Saint Thomas gave us in understanding our Catholic Faith. It is the experience of our Faith in our love for Jesus our Lord at Mass that Saint Thomas had, and that hopefully each one of us have, when we receive Holy Communion at Mass. This was Saint Thomas' ecstasy which can also be ours.
