Be Ready Today and Everyday

Every year, at the end of November, we hear Readings at Mass that speak of "end times" or final things that may happen. We experience these Readings because we are coming to the end of Liturgical Year B (Mark's Gospel), to get ready for the Liturgical Year C (Luke's Gospel), beginning with the First Sunday of Advent. Being the conclusion of the Gospel Readings, at this time of the Autumn season, we hear Jesus basically saying: Hey people, get ready!

Okay, we may say, then we may ask; get ready for what? Answer: Jesus' coming to us personally to give us a more fulfilling life. If we are open to Jesus' invitation, this would mean then one or some of the following:

- -- to offer forgiveness to someone...
- --to start praying that devotion we have put aside.
- --to be more disciplined in our studies and reading. And, for students in school to strive to get better grades.
- --to ask oneself; how can I help out a neighbor or volunteer in our Church?
- --to remind ourselves; are we truly living the Ten Commandments everyday and avoiding the deadly sins?

Jesus, also wants us to know and be ready that He can take our regrets, too. We might be burdened with some of those regrets like for example: if only I knew then what I know now, I would not have done...or, I should have said...

As we find moments during the day to pray, we are opening ourselves up to the Holy Spirit to guide us. It is especially during these times that Jesus can reveal the truth of our lives and also embrace us with His Love. It is in these experiences that we need to be <u>ready to listen</u> to Jesus.

Let's **be ready** for Jesus' Coming into our lives through daily prayer, in order that He may give us a more fulfilling life here on earth, so that we can **be ready** for THE MOST FULFILLING ETERNAL LIFE IN HEAVEN when that **Glorious Day and Hour** arrives for us. God Bless, Father Mark
