#### Sharing our Faith Series Benediction

We, Catholics, find it spiritually helpful, and a great benefit in our relationship with God, to participate in the **Benediction** service at Church. Normally, we have Benediction every First Saturday, immediately following Mass and on Sunday evening during Lent. Benediction consists of the following steps:

**Exposition**--A large, consecrated Host is brought from the Tabernacle and placed in the Monstrance on the Altar. The Monstrance is a large, ornate liturgical vessel used in worship of the Blessed Sacrament. It has a small glass window in which, when placed inside, the Host is visible for the sake of Adoration. The hymn: "O Salutaris Hostia" ("O Saving Victim") is sung at this time while the Monstrance is being incensed.

Next is the time of **Adoration**. During this time, silence is taking place, when we can offer our prayers to the Lord. Also, the priest may share a reflection on Sacred Scripture during this time. Often, people find it especially prayerful by looking at the consecrated Host in the Monstrance and expressing a prayer of thanksgiving.

At the end of Adoration, all kneel and the hymn: "*Tantum Ergo Sacramentum*" ("Down in Adoration Falling") is sung and the incense is used again.

Immediately following this is the **Benediction Song**. The priest chants, "You have given them Bread from Heaven." The people respond, "Having within it all sweetness." The priest then prays the **Eucharistic Blessing**. "Lord Jesus Christ, You gave us the Eucharist as the memorial of Your Suffering and Death. May our worship of this Sacrament of Your Body and Blood, help us to experience the salvation You won for us and the peace of the Kingdom where You live with the Father and the Holy Spirit, God forever and ever. Amen."

The priest now puts the Humeral Veil over his shoulders, goes to the Altar, and blesses the people by making the *Sign of the Cross* with the Monstrance containing the Consecrated Host. After this, the priest kneels in front of the Altar and leads the **Acclamation** with the following words..

"Blessed be God....(and concludes with)
Blessed be God in His Angels and in His Saints."

After this, the Blessed Sacrament is placed in the Tabernacle. Then the concluding hymn "Holy God We Praise Thy Name" is sung.

My brothers and sisters, come to Mass and Benediction on First Saturday mornings at 9 am and experience the Heavenly Graces and Blessings of our Lord in the Holy Eucharist and in Adoration and Benediction.

#### **EVERYONE WANTS TO BE HAPPY**

The Gospel Reading today, according to Luke, gives us the prescription on how to be happy. The word Blessed, is translated into our English language to mean Happy. There are four statements that St. Luke uses to describe how to have blessings, or we would say, happiness. Let's take one of these statements: "Blessed are you who are poor, for the Kingdom of God is yours." (Lk 6: 20) These might not sound like happy words, but what's being said here is that in the midst of your poverty, you will become happy when you see your need for God's Love. If, therefore, you trust in God through daily prayer, eventually, if not sooner, you will be lifted out of your poverty, possibly through other people to help you. Your soul will feel good and satisfied that God has heard your prayer because you put your trust in Him. The Kingdom of God is peace and that peace has come to you because of your faith in God. If your need includes physical poverty, then the Wisdom of God can lead you to the people that can help you out of compassion for you in the midst of your need. They, too, were in need and people had compassion for them. My friends, the important thing when praying and asking God for Blessings is to also pray for the patience in allowing God to do His Work in you.
