A Resurrection Story of Divine Healing

This is a story of a young man, a seminarian, studying for the priesthood. He had come home on Easter Sunday to visit his parents and to stay for a few days before going back to the seminary. They were grateful to see him come home for Easter. But, they had to give him the not so good news that his mother has to go to the hospital the next morning for a biopsy because of an obvious spot that the x-ray had shown.

The son told his parents that we need to pray the rosary and pray for healing. The next day, the seminarian went to daily Mass and in the priest's homily, he said everything will turn out very well, without him knowing anything about the seminarian's mother's medical situation. When the son got home, his mother and father were there and they described to the son that the doctor took a series of x-rays that morning to locate the spot before the biopsy, and the x-ray revealed that the spot was no longer there. To the surprise of the doctor, the cyst was gone. The mother was sent home and her husband and son rejoiced to hear the Good News. This was an Easter gift of Divine Healing through the praying of the Rosary.

My brothers and my sisters, the Resurrection of Christ that we celebrate this day and in these next seven weeks of Easter, is the celebration of Jesus' Divine Healing and Profound Mercy and Forgiveness. Jesus is risen from the dead and has opened the gates of heaven for all of us. In order for us to experience Jesus' Healing and Merciful Forgiveness in our life, we need to simply ask Him to bring healing in the areas of our life as in the story of the seminarian and his mother. In addition, Jesus' Mercy and Forgiveness is always offered to us when we know that we have done something that we should not have done.

As Jesus' closest friends ran to the tomb on that first Easter morning, with their desire to see the Risen Lord, so too, may we have that same enthusiasm every time we pray and believe that somehow, someway, God hears and will answer our prayers. May we also have that same anticipated joy every time we come to Mass and experience the Risen Lord in the Word proclaimed and in the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of our Lord Jesus as we receive Holy Communion.
