

### The Baptism of the Lord and Ours

As we celebrate this Feast Day of the Baptism of the Lord, I want to share with you the steps of the Rite of Baptism for One Child according to the book: Order of Baptism of Children (from the Catholic Book Publishing Corp. New Jersey 2020).

The Baptism ceremony begins with the Priest or Deacon greeting the parents and godparents and all those present. After this greeting prayer, the celebrant (priest or deacon) asks the parents the full name they are giving their child. Then after, the next question is : What do you ask of God's Church for "Joseph Anthony" (for example). The parents response is "Baptism."

After this, the celebrant describes the responsibilities to the parents and godparents and asks them if they are ready to receive this responsibility. Their response is "yes."

After this, the celebrant makes the Sign of the Cross on the forehead of the baby, and the parents and godparents do the same. By doing this, the baby is being claimed for Christ. Following this is a Reading from the Sacred Scriptures. The Word of God is always necessary to proclaim and for the people to hear, because this Word affirms their own Baptism and prepares them to be followers of Christ.

Following this step is the Prayers of the Faithful. After this, a special prayer is prayed, to free the child from Original Sin. The child is then anointed right below the neck with the special Oil of Salvation. The reason for this is that olive oil has always been a symbol of strength in the ancient world. This action strengthens the one who is to be baptized.

The next steps that prepare for the Baptism itself are the following: The Blessing of the Water and the Profession of Faith. The Baptism then officially happens when the celebrant prays the Words of Baptism over the infant: "Anthony Joseph, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen!"

What follows immediately after the Baptism is the Anointing with Chrism Oil. This is a special perfumed oil, the Bishop blesses at the Chrism Mass during Holy Week. This blessing consecrates the person forever to Christ our Lord, as the celebrant makes the Sign of the Cross on the baby's crown of their head. The clothing of the white garment happens next as the parents receive the garment from the presider celebrant and puts it on their newly baptized baby. The garment symbolizes purity. After this, a Baptism Candle is lit and given to the parents. This symbolizes the Light of the Risen Christ. The word, Ephphatha, which means **be opened**, is prayed over the child's ears and the celebrant touches their mouth to symbolize hearing the Word of God and proclaiming their faith in Jesus.

The Concluding Rite includes a concluding prayer, the Our Father, a prayer over the mother, a prayer over the father, and a concluding prayer blessing. **GOD BLESS!**
