A Family Perspective: In today's Gospel, we see the lepers who, despite their intention to thank Jesus for their healing, got so caught up in their excitement that they never got 'around to it.' This is a situation we can all relate to. Often, we become so absorbed in our own lives that we forget to appreciate the blessing we have and the people who have helped us. This week, let's make a conscious effort to take nothing for granted and express our gratitude to those who deserve it.

Jesus, Our Divine Physician

Scene One: A man, in his early 70's, is working to put an addition on his backyard patio. Suddenly, he feels a weakening and paralyzing sensation traveling through the entire right side of his body and extremities. He is taken to the hospital. He is told that he suffered a stroke. His pastor comes to visit him and anoints him with the Oil of the Infirmed. By the end of the day, he feels better. By the end of the week, he is walking with no signs of paralysis. He is back to working on his house. What happened? Divine Healing at work, along with good medicine.

Scene Two: A woman, who completely lost her hearing in both ears, attends a healing service in her church. Along with a priest, several other people are praying over this woman for her to regain her hearing. Within one hour, to the amazement of all, her hearing in both ears is completely restored. What happened? Direct Divine Healing from Jesus, our Divine Physician.

In our First Reading at Mass, from Second Kings 5: 14-17, and in our Gospel Reading, from Lk 17: 11-19, two people are mentioned who have the disease of leprosy. They both had received an immediate direct healing from God. Naaman was healed after the Prophet Elisa told him to wash seven times in the Jordan River and the Samaritan man was one of the ten who was healed by Jesus. Both men thanked God in their own way for having received their healing.

My brothers and sisters, similarly, Jesus is still healing people with illnesses today. Healing can be experienced and received through the laying on of hands and being anointed with the Oil of the Infirmed. At one time, this Sacrament was called Extreme Unction or Last Rites. This was ministered primarily to a person who was dying. It is still given to one close to death, with a much broader meaning and experience today--it can bring about healing to those suffering illness and/or injury, with the hope of recovery and even to someone before an operation.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (paragraph 1507) states "the Risen Lord renews this mission in My Name...they will lay their hands on the sick and they will recover." (Mk 16: 17-18)

My friends, it is true and sad that not all illnesses are healed. In this experience, we share in Christ's Suffering. However, if in good faith we ask Jesus to heal us in the Sacrament of Anointing, a healing, either spiritually or physically, will indeed happen. "Ask and you will receive." (John 16: 24b)
