## **Christian Prayer**

"Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened." (Matthew 7: 7-8)

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* describes prayer as God's Gift. Only when we recognize that God is the giver, and we are the humble ones who receive His Gifts, are we open to prayer. (This is Our Faith by Michael Pennock, page 323)

Prayer is also the place of covenant. Prayer comes from the heart. As the *Catechism* describes: "The heart is our hidden center, beyond the grasp of our reason and of others; only the Spirit of God can fathom the human heart and know it fully" (This is Our Faith by Michael Pennock, page 323) (2563)

Third, prayer is being in communion with God. Prayer is the habit of being in God's Presence.

(Catechism of the Catholic Church 2565) The Scripture passage above from the Gospel of Matthew Chapter 7 is Jesus affirming and encouraging us to truly ask God for spiritual gifts that we need in our life. Several of the most important gifts are the Fruits of the Holy Spirit according to St. Paul's Letter to the Galatians Chapter 5 Verse 22 which reads: "The Fruits of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self control."

In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus speaks of the fig tree being cultivated with the hope of bearing good fruit in the future. We hope that the Fruits of the Holy Spirit will be cultivated and grow in our life as a result of **our prayers we pray to God**. The following prayer is asking Jesus to be His Light and the Fruit of His Presence to shine through us.

# **Radiating Christ** (The Fragrance Prayer)

Dear Jesus,

Help me to spread Your Fragrance wherever I go. Flood my soul with Your Spirit and Life. Penetrate and possess my whole being so utterly, that my life may only be a radiance of Yours. Shine through me, and be so in me that every soul I come in contact with may feel Your Presence in my soul. Let them look up and see no longer me, but only Jesus! Stay with me, and then I shall begin to shine as You shine, so to shine as to be a light to others. The light, O Jesus, will be all from You; none of it will be mine. It will be You, shining on others through me. Let me thus praise You the way You love best, by shining on those around me. Let me preach You without preaching, not by words but by example, by catching force of the sympathetic influence of what I do, the evident fullness of the love my heart bears to you. Amen.

This beautiful prayer was recited daily by Saint Teresa of Calcutta and her Sisters of Charity. This prayer is also known as The Fragrance Prayer. *By Venerable John Henry Cardinal Newman February 21, 1801-August 11, 1890).* God Bless, Father Mark
