My Peace I Give to You

The sun is so very important, along with the rain, to grow flowers and all kinds of vegetation in our gardens and for ecology in general. The sun warms us after many cold days. It does, however, need to be in balance with precipitation; otherwise, everything in nature would be too dry.

Sunlight images the happiness of a day and the joyful, lively activity of work. The light of the moon, shining in late evening and night, images a peacefulness at the end of the day. In a like manner, in our Second Reading in the Book of Revelations, the images of the sun and moon describe the heavenly reward of Divine Light for the persecuted Christians of the first century who remained faithful to the Lord.

"The city had no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God gave it light, and its lamp was the Lamb." (Revelation 21: 23)

In the Gospel of John, Jesus offers the promise of peace in the Holy Spirit for those who need peace with the words "Peace I leave with you; My Peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid." (John 14: 27)

Ask yourself:

- ⊕ Where in my own life do I need peace the most?
- With whom do I need to be at peace in a relationship?

My brothers and sisters, these shining, heavenly gifts from our Second Reading and the promises of peace from our Gospel Reading are here for us right now. Jesus won for us these gifts of light and peace through His Victory of death on the cross and His Resurrection, Ascension, and sending to us the Holy Spirit.

May praying for peace be an important priority

2025 Jubilee Year of Hope-Part 1

Every 25 years, the Catholic Church celebrates a Jubilee year. In 2000, the emphasis was a celebration of entering into a third millennium of Christianity. This Jubilee Year's purpose is a call to return to the Lord Jesus in personal prayer and for a renewed "Holy Commitment" to receive the Sacraments of the Church, namely the Sacrament of Confession and to receive Jesus in the Holy Eucharist (the Mass). This Jubilee's theme is "Pilgrims of Hope." This means we journey in life and faith, together, with other people.

In a unique way, one of the particular celebrations during this month of May, is the "Jubilee of Families." The following prayer has been given to us by the Unites States Council of Catholic Bishops.

"We bless Your Name, O Lord, for sending Your Own Incarnate Son, to become part of a family, so that, as He lived its life, He would experience its worries and its joys. We ask You, Lord, to protect and watch over this family, so that in the strength of Your Grace, its members may enjoy prosperity, possess the priceless gift of Your Peace, and, as the Church alive in the home, bear witness in this world to Your Glory. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen!"
