CHALLENGING: If possible, create a space outside your home to compost food waste. Bonus: Eventually, it creates healthy soil for a garden to grow more food.

What Prayer Is

The traditional Catholic definition of prayer is "the raising to God of one's mind and heart." In recent years, there has been a preference for the definition of prayer as "speaking with God." This understanding is helpful: it includes all types of prayer, and at the same time, reminds us that prayer is not a monologue but a dialogue, a conversation. In prayer, we answer God, Who first spoke through His Word, and especially through the Word made flesh. Our prayer is an answer to Jesus Christ.

It is most helpful to keep in mind the four general types of prayer: adoration, thanksgiving, contrition, and petition. Our prayer can be asking God for something if it is God's Will that we receive it. However, we must beware of praying only when we want something. The ideal, as life goes on, is to give God more adoration and thanksgiving, as well as true contrition in prayer.

In conclusion, my brothers and sisters,

Adoration: This is spending time praying in Church, before the blessed Sacrament, and it is celebrated during the Exposition and the Benediction Service. It can also be quiet meditation and contemplative, alone with God.

Thanksgiving: This prayer can be as easy as thanking God each day when we wake up for life that day! It can be the words: "Thank you, Jesus, for answering my prayers."

Contrition: This prayer is a prayer of sorrow for doing something we know was not helpful, but wrong. It is admitting to God that we have sinned and then asking for His Forgiveness. This prayer is formally expressed when going to confession and praying the Act of Contrition.

Petition: This prayer is asking God for the special intentions we have. It is asking God for personal healing and recovery of good health for ourselves and our loved ones. It is asking for the things we need in life, such as, food, housing, clothes, and employment. It can be asking for things we need that we will also share with others. Our petitions can be just simply asking for a special blessing for a positive outcome of a situation and it can be constantly praying for others and for peace on earth.

As we celebrate this Feast Day today of the Exaltation of the Cross, let's pray in <u>petition</u> for God's Words in John's Gospel Chapter 3: 16 to be fulfilled for ever person on this earth: <u>"For God so loved the world that He gave His Only Son, so that EVERYONE WHO BELIEVES in Him might not perish, but might have eternal life."</u>
