Becoming Humble Servants

Learning and educational development for all of us is so necessary to have and to share with others. In addition, developing a humble, open attitude is very beneficial, especially when learning something new from a familiar teacher or a new teacher.

In a like manner, our love for God and becoming disciples of Christ is a process that requires us to be humble and open to what our Lord Jesus is teaching each of us in our relationship with Him.

The theme of today's Readings is being a humble servant of God. In the First Reading, when Isaiah saw an awesome heavenly vision, he said, "for I am a man of unclean lips." (Is 6: 5a) In the Second Reading, Saint Paul called himself "the least of the apostles." (1 Cor 15: 9a) Peter, in the Gospel Reading, said "depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." (Lk 5: 8) In each of these confessions by Isaiah, Paul, and Peter, we see a humble openness and attitude that took each of them to the next level of spiritual maturity.

Just like Isaiah, Paul, and Peter, we too, are called to our next level of spiritual maturity in our learning of being a disciple of Christ. Apps for your iPhone or computer, such as Verbum, Laudate, and Hallow are very good opportunities and ways of learning our Catholic faith and discipleship with Christ.

Sharing our Faith Series

We Catholics find it very spiritually helpful to wear medals of saints on a chain around our neck or sometimes on a bracelet. This saint may be our Baptism or Confirmation name, but we wear it to serve as a constant reminder that this person loves us and is now living in Heaven, praying for you and for all who call upon them.
